Dydd Gŵyl Dewi Hapus! – Happy Saint David's Day!

St David was born in Wales around 500AD. He was ordained as a priest, lived as a monk and later became the Bishop of Menevia and Archbishop of Wales. During his life, St David founded a number of monasteries. The monks provided hospitality, food and clothes to pilgrims, other travellers and people living in poverty in the

local community. This simple life meant that David became known as 'Dewi Ddyfrwr', David the water drinker. There are many legends about St David. One of the best known is that as he was preaching to a crowd of people, a hill rose up where he was standing so all the people could see him, and a dove landed on his shoulder. It is also said that he cured his elderly teacher, the monk St Paulinus, of blindness. St David died on 1st March 589AD, and is buried in the grounds of his monastery, where the Cathedral of St David now stands.
