# THE CATHOLIC CHURCHES IN THE ST. BONIFACE DEANERY ISLE OF WIGHT



Today is the day of palms. It celebrates the beginning of Holy Week and the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem for the Feast of the Passover, which celebrates God's freeing the chosen people from slavery in Egypt. It was the custom for pilgrims to come to Jerusalem to worship at the temple for this great feast. There was a ritual of welcome and entrance to the city for them. Palms were spread on their route into the city, and as they entered the travellers sang the familiar Hallel Psalms, songs of praise, known to every practising Jew.

In the reading of the Passion from Mark's gospel we see Jesus in deep anguish, feeling abandoned by both friends and God. At the same time, Jesus shows incredible strength, faith and obedience. Jesus was faithful to his mission as servant and Messiah, even when it cost him his life. Jesus freely embraced death, an execution so painful and shameful that the Romans would not inflict it on one of their own. From the midst of intense suffering, human mockery, and the experience of abandonment, Jesus "breathed out" his life. A Roman centurion, a Gentile, recognises the true identity of Jesus: "Truly this man was the Son of God." (Mark 15:39) Jesus, the one both hailed and derided as king of the Jews, the one crucified, is finally revealed in his deepest identity as Son of God.

During Holy Week, we prayerfully remember the events of Jesus' passion and death. The essence of discipleship is that we don't simply receive the fruit of Jesus' suffering and death; the essence of discipleship is that we align our own identity with that of Jesus, accept self-denial and self-giving, and in this way walk with him to the cross. Disciples go wherever the Master goes.

**MAKING THIS WEEK HOLY** This coming week we are invited to make this week holy; we are called to be humble and enter into the spirit of the week which has changed the world and celebrate these great events of God's love.

**MAUNDY THURSDAY** We celebrate this Mass as the great gift of the Eucharist and the institution of the priesthood. After the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose where we are invited, if we wish, to spend some time with Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane.

**GOOD FRIDAY** is a day of fasting and abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed by all over the age of 14. The law of fast binds those between the ages of 18 and 59. Check Mass Times page for the Celebration the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord, the opportunity to venerate the wood of the cross in Ryde, and plenty of options for the Stations of the Cross around the island.

**HOLY SATURDAY** The Vigil Mass is the most important Mass in the church's year. It is a wonderful celebration, full of simple Easter joy

#### **GOOD FRIDAY WALKS OF WITNESS**

**NEWPORT** Starts at 1230 outside the Congregational Church, first stop the garden of St Thomas of Canterbury Catholic church for readings and prayer.

**WEST WIGHT:** Starts at the Memorial Hall at 1000, proceeds along the Avenue with pauses for reflection, concludes with a short service on the Library Green. Refreshments at Freshwater Methodist Church. Wet weather venue – Freshwater Methodist Church.

**EAST COWES:** Starts at 1100 from Albert Cottage, York Avenue.

**EASTER SUNDAY SON-RISE SERVICE** Sunday 31st March, 0630 on the shore at Freshwater Bay. Although the actual sunrise is not visible from the bay, the change from darkness to daylight is striking. This service will not take place if the weather is too inclement. Please note that the clocks spring forward on Easter Morning.
