EPIPHANY MYSTERIES

The Epiphany of the Lord, the Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, concludes the Twelve Days of Christmas. There are three Epiphany mysteries concerning this "showing forth" of Christ's glorious divinity. The first is the revelation to the Magi from the East – these mysterious royal figures, who come bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and who, after kneeling in adoration before the newborn King, return home by "another way" (in their case, to avoid murderous Herod, but also suggesting that an encounter with Christ may mean life not being the same again).

The second Epiphany mystery is the Baptism of the Lord, when the sinless Christ, standing in solidarity with sinful humanity on Jordan's banks, submits to John's baptism of



repentance. Here the author of life, and of Christian baptism, takes us with him into his immersion in the waters, pointing to our sharing in the baptism of his Passion, Death and Resurrection. At that moment, the Lord is anointed with the Holy Spirit, descending as a dove, and the heavenly voice affirms that Christ is the Beloved Son in whom the Father is well-pleased. We too, as "mini-Christs", are God's beloved sons and daughters and in whom he delights to be well-pleased.

The Marriage at Cana forms the third Epiphany mystery, when Christ is revealed as the true Bridegroom, and Mary his Mother intercedes ("they have no wine"), pointing to the need for obedience to her Son ("do whatever he tells you"). Brackish water is transformed into glorious, enriching wine, gladdening the heart. "This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Gaililee, and manifested his glory, and his disciples believed in him." (John 2:11)

May we, having experienced Christmas blessings, be drawn to the Light of Epiphany, offering him the costliest treasures of our hearts and lives.

FILIPINO SPONSORED MASS – FEAST OF ST NINO

Sunday 14 January, St Mary's, Ryde, 1100 followed by reception and food sharing in parish hall. 'The Feast of St Nino has a special significance in Cebu because of its historical background. Cebu marks the birth of Christianity in the Philippines. The original statue of St Nino was given in April 1521 by the Portuguese explorer, Ferdinand Magellan to Hara Amihan (Queen Juana) as a baptismal gift. It was a similar statue to the Infant Jesus of Prague. This event was quickly acknowledged as miraculous, and a church was later built on the purported site of the discovery.'
