

Holy Cross Catholic Primary School CURRICULUM INFORMATION YEAR 4 Summer Term 1



Subject	What are we learning?	How can you help at home?
English THE GREAT KAPOK TREE INFORMATION	In our English we will be linking our writing to our reading, history and design technology! We will be looking at writing a persuasive piece of narrative to address the serious issue of deforestation, as well as writing a non-fiction piece of writing based on the rainforest. We are doing a deep dive study from the beautiful story of 'The Great Kapok tree' by Lynne Cherry where we will have a strong focus on spelling and grammar before reaching our final writing outcomes.	 Practise the Year 3/4 statutory spellings with your child at home – as well as writing them, you could play games to help learn them. Encourage your children to research about deforestation, discuss the topic with them. Is there anything they want to find out? Encourage your children to practice their persuasive writing. It can be about anything as long as they are capturing that persuasive language. This will help build muscle memory for independent writing.
Reading	 This half term we will be looking at the exquisitely illustrated nonfiction text 'Under the canopy' by Iris Volant We will have a series of tasks that will allow us to share our ideas and opinions, using inference and comprehension to answer questions. At the end of the term, children will be exploring the rainforest further by writing a piece of poetry to reflect upon the topic of deforestation. 	 Read frequently with your child – encouraging improved pace and fluency of reading. Ask your child questions whilst reading together - what do they think will happen next? What is their opinion of the text? If they were that character, what would they do? Write down their amazing efforts in their reading records, including any inferences or ideas they had about the book. It would be great to see their opinions!
Maths	In Maths we will be learning about decimals. We will be understanding the values of different decimals and how to work with them in order to apply them to more complex problems. We will be applying them through fluency, problem solving and reasoning. In the second part of the term we will be moving on to money and time. During this we will be taking a look into measuring, equivalency, conversion and adding/subtracting. Finally, we will be practicing our times tables as frequently as possible, ready for the statutory times tables tests in June. Science	In Science we will be looking at 'States of Matter'.	Discuss with your child what they have learnt in class.
	We will be exploring and comparing materials according to the group they are in and identifying the properties of each group. We will also be investigating the change of state when materials are heated or cooled and how this affects their state.	Safely explore and find different states of matter and how they can be made/change.
	Children will learn all about the process of evaporation and investigate how this happens. Finally, Children will be conducting an experiment to research the temperature at which materials change state.	



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Art & DT	In Art this half term, we will be looking at masks. We will be linking to our history topic to explore Ancient Mayan masks. PSHE	In PSHE we are looking at the topic 'Created to Live in Community' which explores the individual's relationship with the wider world. We will explore how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service, through dialogue and through working for the Common Good.	Discuss with your child how they have a relationship with the wider world. Discuss and encourage your child to share their ideas of how they can work for the common good within the wider community.
Music	In Music all the learning is focused around one song: Blackbird. The material presents an integrated approach to music where games, the interrelated dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.), singing and playing instruments are all linked.	Encourage them to listen to different types of music. Getting them to reflect on what they have heard through discussion.
French	In French we will be looking at the topic 'What's the time?' In this unit, we will learn how to tell the time in French including o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. They'll interpret and answer questions about timetables, and finish with a maths lesson calculating the difference between two times - in French!	Practice the French words and phrases with your child. Recap these throughout the term to aid their fluency and recall.
