On Thursday 6th March, we will be celebrating World Book Day. World Book Day was created with the aim to change lives through encouraging a love of books and shared reading.

At Holy Cross, we are always keen to promote reading. **Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success** – more than family circumstances, or parents' educational background or income. We want to help all children to have a life-long habit of reading for pleasure, and the improved life chances this brings them. Spending **just 10 minutes a day** reading and sharing stories with children can make a crucial difference to their future success.

As part of World Book Day, your child is welcome to come to school dressed as a favourite literary character – even better if they can bring the book in with them too. Of course, we understand that not every child enjoys dressing up and that costumes may come at a financial or time cost, so **dressing up is entirely optional.** For those who do not wish to dress up, sensible mufti clothes are fine.
