

ON THE WAY (OF TRUE DISCIPLESHIP)



A few Sundays ago, we began covering the middle section of Mark's gospel. Starting from chapter 8 verse 27 and running through to chapter 10 verse 45, this section is what biblical scholars often refer to as 'on the way' or 'the way'. It is a key turning point in Mark's gospel which is set off by Peter's profession of faith when he declares Jesus to be the Christ, the promised Messiah (8:29). From here onwards, Jesus begins to lead his disciples from the region of Galilee 'on the way' to Jerusalem, where he must go to fulfil his

mission. It is a mission of suffering that will culminate in the crucifixion and resurrection.

Within these two and half chapters, Jesus prophesies and confirms to his disciples three times that his mission will cause him to have to suffer grievously, be condemned to death, but then he will rise again after three days. Built around these three Passion predictions, we can notice a repeated pattern occurs by which each prediction is followed by the misunderstanding of one or more of the disciples, and then a corrective teaching is given by Jesus about the requirements of true discipleship.

In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus repeated the prophecy about his Passion the second time. His disciples did not understand what this meant and were afraid to ask him. Still ruled by worldly thoughts, they started arguing among themselves who was the greatest. Jesus had to correct their failure to see that self-ambition has no place in his Kingdom. Again, in this week's gospel the disciple John stands in need of correction for trying to stop a man using Jesus' name to cast out a devil. John describes this man as "not one of us". However, Jesus says that "whoever is not against us is for us". He warns of severe consequences for anyone who is an "obstacle to bring down any little ones who have faith".

Being a disciple of Jesus means letting him lead the way. It means allowing our own limited human understanding to be transformed into his way of understanding. Fr Stephen Vooght

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY On 7 October, we celebrate a well-loved memorial in honour of the Rosary, and according to a long-standing tradition, the entire month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. In the Rosary, with its sequence of prayers and mysteries, we contemplate the Gospel in company with the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Pope Saint John Paul II wrote in 2002, "The Rosary . . . is a prayer loved by countless Saints and encouraged by the Magisterium. Simple yet profound, it still remains, at the dawn of the third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness . . .

With the Rosary, the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depth of his love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive an abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer" (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, 1).
