THE FALSE PIETY OF THE PHARISEES



This Sunday we return to Mark's gospel. We pick it up from chapter 7, which follows on from Jesus performing a whole series of miracles, including the multiplication of loaves, walking on the water and healings of many who were sick. These miracles not only further inspire his close disciples, but also cause great enthusiasm among the witnessing crowds who are clamouring after him "so that they might touch only the tassel of his cloak" and thus receive his healing power. However, Jesus is now confronted by

certain Pharisees who are intent on challenging his authenticity and his faithfulness to the Mosaic Laws and traditions. They demand to know why he and his disciples are eating food with unclean hands and failing to observe the tradition of the elders? This custom was concerned not with hygiene but with ritual purity. However, Jesus accuses them of hypocrisy. He sees how they are guilty of the same false piety that the prophet Isaiah described when he said: "these people honour me with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me." The real problem is not dirty hands but a polluted heart, which no amount of washing can clean. Jesus exposes their wrong thinking. It is not clean hands but a clean heart that matters.

The biblical scholar, William Barclay, offers us the following apt summary of this particular gospel message: "There is no greater religious peril than that of identifying religion with outward observance. There is no commoner religious mistake than to identify goodness with certain so called religious acts. Church-going, bible-reading, careful financial giving, even time-tabled prayer do not make a person a good person. The fundamental question is, how is a person's heart towards God and towards his fellow neighbours? And if in his heart there are enmities, bitterness, grudges, pride, not all the outward observances in the world will make him anything but a hypocrite."
