WHAT MUST WE DO? BE JOYFUL.

The prophet Zephaniah, in the first reading, says, "Shout for joy, rejoice, exult with all your heart." He tells us that God is here with us, within us, and among us. God drives away our enemies, renews us, and brings us new life through His love. He will even dance with shouts of joy for us. Zephaniah gives us a message of hope and joy. Today, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday – Rejoicing Sunday. We hear that God rejoices over us

because He renews us with His love. If we want to live joyful and happy lives, we must act with love, beginning by loving ourselves.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we all want to be happy, but often we are reluctant to love. We may want to love but resist humbling ourselves. We might desire humility and forgiveness or want to apologise, but our pride often holds us back.

Here's a little story you might have heard before: One day, a professor stood in front of his class holding a glass of water. He asked the students, "How heavy is this glass of water?" They gave different answers. The professor held the glass for ten minutes and asked again, "How heavy is it now?" The students replied, "It's the same." Of course, the weight of the glass hadn't changed, but the burden the professor felt was much greater. Holding it for so long had caused pain.

In a similar way, we often hold onto grudges for years, which weighs us down and hinders our happiness. Letting go of these burdens renews our lives. If Jesus is born in our hearts, we will find peace and joy.

We celebrate birthdays for the living, not the dead. At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus' birthday because we believe He is alive. Just as we give gifts on birthdays, we give presents at Christmas to share and show love.

Today's Gospel reminds us: What must we do? This year, let us try to add some people to our list who we find difficult to love. If we find this hard, St Paul encourages us in the second reading to ask and pray for what we need. Shall we reflect on this together: What must we do? Fr Nishan

This month, let the paradox of Christ's birth and childhood strike us a new. SUPPORT FOR OUR HOSPICE There will be a second collection after all Masses this weekend in support of the Mountbatten hospice. There are two reasons for this; firstly, that they urgently need financial support and secondly, as a response to the recent Parliamentary vote on assisted suicide. We and the whole Church oppose this legislation, but we have to do more by offering an alternative and positive vision. The antidote to assisted suicide is better end of life care and on the Island, we rely heavily on our hospice for this.
