What are we learning?	How can you help at home?

Our RE work after the break will begin with Easter. Connections are made in this unit between the events of Easter, Holy Week, the teachings and life of Jesus and the celebration of the Eucharist. There is also a focus on the appearance of Jesus to his disciples. Symbolism of the Easter season, including the liturgical colours will also be explored.	The children have been enjoying learning about the Easter story. Can the children recreate this at home? Any little books, writing or pictures will be welcome in school where the children could share during our show and tell time.
We will also spend some time learning about Hindu worship, as part of our multi-faith learning.	
In History, we will be focusing on The Romans. We will be learning about the extent of the Roman Empire, what Britain was like when the Romans invaded, how they settled in Britain and what important building works still remain today. We will be visiting the Roman Villa at Brading to support our learning. Details of this trip will be shared after the Easter break.	You could look at a map to show where the Romans first invaded Britain in Kent and then travelled North West to London. Can you help them find any famous Roman roads and also the City of Bath where there are some famous Roman Baths. Encourage your child to talk about their visit to the Roman Villa.
Through our 'School Life' topic, we will learn key vocabulary related to school. We will learn key vocabulary related to objects, subjects and prepositional language, before moving on to learning questions and answers which we would use at school.	Ask your child to share the new vocabulary they have learned with you. If you know any French, you could help your child practise their newest phrases and knowledge!
