HUMILITY AND LOVE

"I am only an ordained priest, not crippled"



My dear sisters and brothers in Christ; in the first reading, Cornelius, a centurion in the Roman army, knelt at St Peter's feet and prostrated himself. St Peter in humility said "I am only a man after all". It reminds me of an event in seminary, Oscott College. One day after Mass, we tried to clear the chairs in the church. A priest also was helping us. I said "Father, please leave and let us do it". He replied "I am only a priest, not crippled". It always remains with me. We have to humble ourselves so

that we can love others. At this moment, we could be a priest, teacher, doctor, manager, owner or any professional or not but if we do not have love we are nothing.

The reading says, the pagans have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have. Sometimes we think about the others and even our children who do not come to church but they are great. Because, they have received the Holy Spirit. One day they will realise it and come back like Cornelius.

Do we fear God and do what is right? If we do then we are God's people. The second reading says, if you love others then you come from God. Once upon a time my aunt said, "If you want to love then you should be ready to cry". My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, without sacrifice there is no love. God loves us so much that He sacrificed His Son. Jesus loves us so much that He sacrificed his life for us; our parents love us so much that they sacrificed their life for us and so on. The Gospel reading says that "A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends". Mother Teresa writes "Love comes from family". As we are in the month of May, we can stay together and pray the Rosary together.
