We will be looking at writing our own newspaper report and fairytale with a twist. We are starting with 'The Story of Tutankhamun' and writing our own newspaper reports to inform Egyptian civilians about the discovery of his tomb, and the supposed curse that followed. We will then switch to the text of 'The Egyptian Cinderella', where we will focus on writing our own version of a classic fairytale based in Ancient Egypt.	Practise the Year 3/4 statutory spellings with your child at home – as well as writing them, you could play games to help learn them. Talk about the history topic with your child - what have they remembered? Is there anything in particular they have found interesting?
Reading	This half term we will be looking at the author Joe Todd-Stanton, with the two texts 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' and 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx'. We will practise our fluency whilst reading, along with our predicting and inference skills. We will have a session of tasks that will allow us to share our ideas and opinions, finally reaching a conclusion about the book.	Read frequently with your child – encouraging improved pace and fluency of reading. Ask your child questions whilst reading together - what do they think will happen next? What is their opinion of the text? If they were that character, what would they do? Write down their amazing efforts in their reading records, including any inferences or ideas they had about the book. It would be great to see their opinions!
Maths	 In maths we will be looking at Place Value for the first four weeks. We will be looking at thousands, hundreds, tens and ones, and applying them through fluency, problem solving and reasoning. We will then deepen this knowledge by applying it to addition and subtraction work for the last three weeks of the half term. The children will be adding and subtracting using thousands, hundreds, tens and ones. Finally, we will be practising our times tables as frequently as possible, ready for the statutory times tables tests. 	 Help your child to practise their new maths knowledge by encouraging them to read and write four-digit numbers and by using addition and subtraction skills. Continue to practise times tables facts, including division facts, as frequently as possible. Finally, we will be learning how to perform a musical piece using our voices.	Practice singing with your child. Encourage them to listen to other works by Abba and listen for similarities between the songs.
French	In French we will be looking at the topic 'All Around Town'. They will be learning names of places they may find in an everyday town and some useful phrases they can use to ask where the nearest shop is.	Practice the French words and phrases with your child. Recap these throughout the term to aid their fluency and recall.
Homework	 For Homework this term, we are prioritising the key skills children need to underpin their learning: Reading, Phonics, Spelling and Times Tables. Please ensure your child reads their reading book at least 5 times per week and this needs to be recorded in their reading record. Children need to bring their reading book and reading record into school every day. Spellings should be learned daily and will be tested weekly. Practise times tables and the related division facts daily using <u>Times Tables Rockstars</u> – your child should have brought home a log in already.
