AM I A SERVANT AND A VIRTUOUS MAN?

One day, a shepherd lost a sheep and had been searching and praying for it. An angel appeared to him and gave him two options. The first was: "Do you want your sheep back?" The second was: "Do you want to know who stole it?" The shepherd chose the latter, saying, "I want to see who took my sheep." The angel brought a lion before the shepherd, and the lion killed the shepherd as well. This Sunday's reading speaks to us about what happens to a virtuous man, why we need to be servants to all, and why sometimes, when we pray, our prayers are not answered.

The Book of Wisdom teaches us about what the godless say about a virtuous man. In our day-to-day life, we often judge others immediately before getting to know them or their background. Sometimes, we focus on what others are doing rather than reflecting on ourselves. As Scripture says, "Hypocrite! First, take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye." (Mt 7:5). The Book of Wisdom reminds us that if we are God's sons and daughters, He will take care of us.

In the second reading, St. James writes about our "intentions" and how we reap what we sow. If we find disharmony in our hearts, it is because there is jealousy present. When we pray and do not receive what we ask for, it may be due to our intentions, as God has His own plans for us. St. James says, "It is because you have not prayed properly, but have prayed for something to indulge your own desires." Last week, we reflected on how Jesus rebuked St. Peter, saying, "Get behind me, Satan." Peter's thoughts were not aligned with God's way, but with man's way.

Therefore, before asking God for something, we must reflect on how we are living our lives. If our lives are aligned with God's ways, then Psalm 37:5 reminds us: "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him, and He will act." The Gospel reading echoes last week's message: "Suffering leads to exaltation." Jesus reveals His Passion to His disciples for the second time, showing us that His suffering serves as an example for our lives. He calls us to be servants to all and to come to Him like children – that is, with innocence and humility of heart. Are we ready to purify our intentions and become servants to all? **Fr Nishan**
