

Holy Cross Catholic Primary School CURRICULUM INFORMATION YEAR 6 Autumn Term 2



Subject	What are we learning?	How can you help at home?
English	In our English journey, we are focusing on the book 'Fantastically Great Women Who Changed the World', by Kate Pankhurst, which is documenting the stories of astounding women who have achieved amazing things by following their hearts, talents and dreams. Our outcome will involve writing a persuasive letter to the king, from the perspective of Emmeline Pankhurst.	Encourage your child to explore and discover different historical female pioneers. Practise spellings with your child at home - play games, use written practise or verbally practise the Year 5/6 statutory spellings.
Reading Sounce GIFTED Co BLACK	Linking to our English writing text, we will be studying the book 'Young, Gifted and Black', by Jamia Wilson. The book contains a collection of stories about 52 icons of colour to encourage, inspire and empower the next generation of changemakers. We will be developing a range of skills such as: making plausible predications using evidence from the text; continuing to make inferences, but focusing on using the texts evidence in our explanations; retrieving, recording and making comparisons and summarising the text.	Read frequently with your child - practise their pace, fluency and encourage them to read with expression. Ask your child a range of questions whilst reading together. Can they predict what might happen from details stated and implied? Encourage them to use their inference skills to explain and justify their answers. Write down their amazing efforts in their reading records, including any inferences or ideas they had about the book. It would be great to see their predictions and summaries!
Maths * S *	In maths, we are continuing to focuse on the four arithmetic operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Using their knowledge of the order of operations, children will perform mental calculations and identifying common factors, multiples and prime numbers. We will be solving multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why. Once this unit is completed we will be moving onto fractions.	Encourage your child to practise their maths knowledge. Encourage them to practise their addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills through formal written methods and doing mental calculations. Use real life situations to encourage mental maths using the four operations. Continue to practise times tables facts, this can be done on the Times Tables Rockstars website: <u>https://ttrockstars.com/</u>
RE	In RE, we are continuing to learn about Catholic Social Teaching, to answer the key question of, 'How does Catholic Social Teaching guide us to do the right thing? This unit explores how we can all make a difference, however small, to improve our common home. We will explore the Christian duty to lead by example and reach out to those in need. Our key scriptures are: Genesis 1:1-31 and Acts 2:42-47. Once we finish this unit we will be focusing on advent.	Encourage your child to further study the seven themes that is the foundation of Catholic Social Teaching. Have discussions on how these seven themes contribute to making our community a better place.
