

"Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have." (Lk 24:39)



These words of Jesus from this Sunday's gospel of Luke are part of his Resurrection narrative. Like John's gospel, Luke gives us graphic physical descriptions of the risen Jesus (cf. Lk 24:13ff & Jn 20:20ff - walking, sitting and eating with his disciples). These physical details help to highlight three points: (a) the reality of the Resurrection – it was no mere ghost or spirit that encountered the disciples; (b) the continuity between the risen Lord and the earthly Jesus – he is presented as identical with the Jesus that lived and died; (c) the disciples' status as witnesses – his followers recognised him as the Jesus they had known.

Luke and John's physical emphasis is not meant to be taken in a literal sense only, as that would give the idea that Jesus' resurrection was no more than resuscitation of a corpse. Elsewhere, we find that both evangelists also give indications of the risen Jesus having a new and transformed existence. This is evident when they attribute to him a certain 'heavenly otherness':

he passes through closed doors (Jn 20:19, 26); he suddenly appears and disappears (Lk 24:31-36).

Helping us to understand the meaning of Jesus' new resurrected reality, St Pope Paul VI explains: "Jesus rose again in the same body he had taken from the Blessed Virgin, but in new conditions, vivified by a new and immortal animation, which imposes on Christ's flesh the laws and energies of the Spirit"

Theologian, Gerald O'Collins, also offers us further clarity on its meaning: "God did not discard Jesus' corpse, but mysteriously raised and transfigured it so as to reveal what lies ahead for human beings and their world.... redemption is not an escape to a better world but an extraordinary transformation of this world."
