Building on the understanding that we have been created out of love and for love, we will explore how we take this calling into our family, friendships and relationships, and we will learn strategies for developing healthy relationships and keeping safe both online and in our daily lives. Computing	We will be looking at 'Programming — Repetition in Shapes'. We will create programs by planning, modifying and testing commands to create shapes and patterns. We will use Logo, a text-based programming language. This is the first of two programming units in Year 4 and in this unit, we will be focusing on repetition and loops within programming.	Have a go at practising some of the commands learnt at school at home on Logo! What patterns can you create?
