

## Science

In our science topic this half term we will be finding out about health and movement. We will learn about how humans get nutrition from their food, what food groups are, and what a balanced diet looks like. We will then move onto explore the different diets of animals, and what each of these diets consists of. We will then explore what human and animal skeletons look like and make comparisons.

## RE

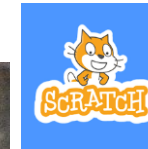
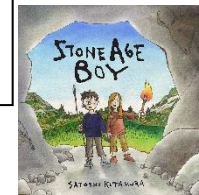

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## History

Our history topic this half term is, 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. We will be learning about how humans adapted and changed through the years of the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and will look at Stonehenge and Skara Brae as examples of historical evidence. We will partake on an exciting visit to Stonehenge to explore historical artefacts and will learn about the evidence that categorises each period of time.

## Art

Our art topic this half term is 'Stone Age Art', which compliments our history topic beautifully. We will explore a range of historic images to inspire our thinking and practice a range of techniques, including mixing tints, tones and shades, sculpting with clay and shading with pencils and charcoal, to produce our own cave art inspired pieces. We will look in detail at 'the Lion Man' statue to inspire our work,

## English

Linking with our History and Art topics, we will explore the text 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura and use this text to develop and inspire our own Stone Age setting description and narrative. We will use a range of writing techniques to develop our fictional writing, including expanded noun phrases, using first person pronouns, prepositions and paragraphing.
