#### MERCY – LOVE – BELIEF

In the last few weeks, we remembered the passion of Christ and celebrated His resurrection. We knew that Jesus suffered and died for all our sins. Of course, He rose from the dead because He wanted to live amongst us and within us. He did not want to leave us alone so He sent the Holy Spirit upon us.

When we reflect on His passion, we feel pity on Him because He died for us. He had mercy on us. And we are called upon to have mercy on our sisters and brothers. Today, the first reading speaks to us about unity. "The

group of believers was united, heart, and soul" – this portrays the profound value of the early Christian community. They were caring and loving towards each other in their needs, financially, spiritually and physically. In the second reading St Paul says that "whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has already over come the world". If we believe in God then we will love God and If we have love in God then we will keep His commandments.

The Gospel reading speaks to us about the appearance of Christ to His disciples. One of His disciples was not there when Jesus appeared to the others. He did not believe in Jesus' appearance. Imagine that even the disciple who lived and listened to him did not believe in His resurrection. What about us? Do we also need to put our finger on His side to believe in Him. Jesus said "you believe because you can see me – happy are those who have not seen and yet believe".

Today, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Since 2000, the second Sunday of Easter has also been known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope John Paul II canonised Sr Faustina on the 30 April 2000. Jesus told Sr Faustina "Humanity will not find peace until it turns trustfully to Divine Mercy" Sr Faustina wrote in her diary "I feel tremendous pain when I see the sufferings of my neighbours". We knew that the writing on the Divine Mercy picture says "Jesus I trust in you".

Do we trust in him? So that we will love Him and believe in Him. Therefore we can keep his commandments.

**APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST** During the month of April, we give special honour to the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist, the Second Vatican Council taught us, is "the source and summit of Christian life" (Lumen Gentium, 11). What does it mean? It means that our participation in the Eucharist is the source from which we draw our strength to live as Jesus taught and to serve in his name. It is also the summit, the high point of our communal life. We use the word Eucharist to describe our celebration of the Mass. We use the same word when we speak of the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. In this month of the Holy Eucharist, let us participate more fully and actively in the Church's liturgy, our celebration of the Eucharist. And let us take time, too, for quiet adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and become more aware of the wondrous way Christ comes to us in the Eucharist.

**REGINA CAELI** During Eastertide the Regina Caeli replaces the Angelus.

- V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, Alleluia!
- R. For he whom you did merit to bear, Alleluia!
- V. Has risen, as He said, Alleluia!
- R. Pray for us to God, Alleluia!
- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia!
- R. For the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia!



O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life, through the same Christ, Our Lord. Amen.
