

## THE CATHOLIC CHURCHES IN THE ST. BONIFACE DEANERY ISLE OF WIGHT



On the Second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear about the Transfiguration of the Lord. We join Peter, James and John, the chosen three who witnessed the Transfiguration, because we like them, need to draw strength from our Lenten journey from this vision of Christ in glory. The cross is coming; but the cross is not an end in itself. Suffering will give way to glory.

In Mark's gospel, the Transfiguration comes immediately after Peter's confession at Caesarea Philippi and Jesus' first prediction of the Passion. Peter had reacted strongly to Jesus' words, taking Jesus aside and rebuking him. Jesus has reacted equally strongly to Peter's rejection: "Get behind me, Satan" (Mk 8:33). From the first moment when Jesus mentions the cross, it is a source of scandal for his disciples.

This is the context for today's reading. We know something wonderful is going to happen from the first lines of the Gospel, since, in scripture, only good things happen on a high mountain, the place where prophets encounter God. The vision of Christ in glory is so wonderful that Peter wants to remain there forever. The voice of God comes from a cloud, urging them to listen to Jesus. Jesus is the 'beloved Son' of God. The Passion is the only way to the glory they have seen.

We too need to listen to Jesus. We need to quiet the many and competing voices within and outside of us so we can hear Jesus' voice. And perhaps the most difficult voice to quell is that which keeps us from following Jesus in his willingness to die to self for the good of others. Yet, to listen to Jesus is to take upon ourselves lives obedient to the divine will, a kind of living which inevitably means we put God and the good of others ahead of our own selfish desires. We must learn to die to self so we can share in transfigured glory. This is the purpose of our Lenten practices: to listen to God and grow in obedience to whatever God is asking of us.
